



Webinars make meetings easy to attend, either on your own or with a group of members seated around one PC. A webinar features online visuals accompanied by audio on your home or office speaker phone, and allows questions and answers. Registrants receive a toll-free number and pass code that will allow entrance to the seminar. Your pin number, hookup instructions and handouts will be emailed to you.

Webinar attendance is simple if you follow these important guidelines:

Computer system requirements: PC-based attendees will need either Windows2000, XP Home, XP Pro. 2003 Server, Vista or newer. Macintosh users will need Mac OS 10.4 (Tiger) or newer.

Audio connection. The most common method is a speaker phone, or computer speakers and microphone if available.

Register in advance on line through the GoToWebinar link emailed to you from the District, which will send you to the registration website.

Open and save the e-mail confirmation. It will contain the date and time of the webinar, the link to join, and the call in number and access code to join the Webinar, plus a password if required.

Join the Webinar a few minutes before the starting time, using the information in the confirmation, sign on the system first, then dial in the call in number for audio. A screen will be displayed when the "Host" has joined. The Host will provide further instructions at the start of the meeting.

This webinar is for the club officers and any members who would like to be on the session with us. So make your plans to participate at one of the times below and keep an eye out for an email giving details on how to get connected and the code needed to get on for this online event.

BUILDING MEMBERSHIP DURING A RECESSION

Effects of a Recession In economics, recession describes the reduction of a country's gross domestic product (GDP) for at least two quarters. Our current recession is said to have started in December of 2007. Though Wall Street has since rebounded, unemployment continues to grow and wages generally remain static. In such a hard economic climate, many people have a tendency to be less altruistic, less inclined to contribute to a good cause. And for many, paying dues for membership in a civic organization like Civitan may not seem like a good idea in uncertain times.

as the housing bubble burst, serious damage rippled throughout the American economy. And we, as Civitans, may feel the effects on our efforts.

So What does This Mean to Civitans? History shows we may have to work a little harder to grow membership. Seven years after Civitan became an international civic club, the Great Depression almost strangled the new movement, as enrollment and fundraising dropped drastically. Though not a member himself (like his successor, Roosevelt) Herbert Hoover tried to encourage the growth of such clubs, praising their "mutual advancement, self-expression, and neighborly helpfulness."

The organization suffered another drop in membership during World War II, but Civitan persevered, organizing scrap metal collections, war bond sales, and blood drives. One club in Birmingham held so many successful bond drives that the Army Air Forces named a B-25 and a P-47 in the club's honor.

After World War II, as the economy bounced back, Civitan tripled in size between 1946 and 1956. So as conditions get better, we can expect our prospects to improve. In the meantime, as Civitans we shouldn't let the recession put us into a depression. Let's just work harder to spread the word about our clubs and our causes. 


